 **Friday 4 December 2020**




Course Description

This one-day postmortem course will combine both lectures and practical sessions.

A morning of lectures will provide an overview of techniques for adult, foetal/foal and placental examination, with some examples of common lesions and pitfalls to avoid.

The remainder of the day will be spent examining macroscopic specimens, to include detailed cardiac examination, approaches to examination of the feet and head, and placental examination.
