

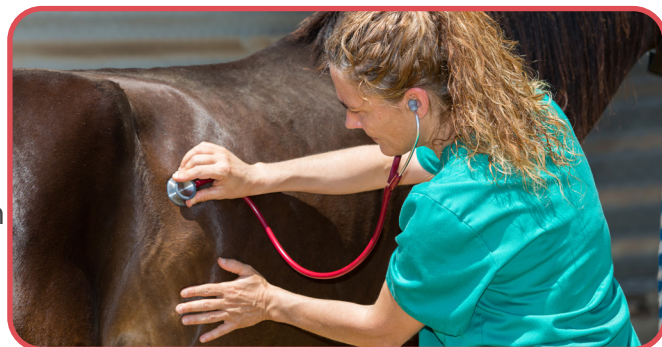
Fundamentals of Gastroenterology

- Know how to carry out further investigations, including where indicated basic abdominal ultrasound.

- Have confidence in their decision to refer.
